Peter Cartwright
Specialist Bereavement Counsellor,
Conference Host

Peter has over twenty years of experience of both counselling bereaved people and supporting families affected by a loved one's drug or alcohol use. He has brought these two strands together to develop a specialism in substance-related bereavements through his work as a counsellor, trainer, researcher and author. He is the lead author of 'Supporting people bereaved through a drug- or alcohol-related death', the first book to specifically address how to support and counsel these marginalised people, published in September 2020.

He works with DrugFAM to provide training and clinical supervision to their staff and volunteers, and facilitates their quarterly bereavement support group.

Fiona Spargo-Mabbs founded a drugs education charity in 2014 in response to the death of her 16-year-old son Daniel from ecstasy. The charity aims to support young people to make safe choices and reduce harm, and works with young people, parents, teachers and professionals across the UK. Her book for parents, 'I wish I'd known', was published in May 2021.

Fiona brings to this role extensive experience from many years of working in education at operational and strategic levels locally and nationally. Her passionate commitment to do all she can to prevent what happened to her son happening to anyone else drives everything she does.

Dr Sangeeta Mahajan

Dr Sangeeta Mahajan is mother to Saagar, a lovely young man who loved playing the drums, speaking French, playing cricket, cackling like a child and making people laugh. He was a gentle soul with a heart of gold. Sadly, after a brief but severe illness, he died by suicide six years ago. He was 20.

Sangeeta is a Mental Health activist, advocate and educator. She is a Trustee of the national charity for prevention of young suicide, PAPYRUS. She dreams of a world where everyone lives with hope. Aside from individually supporting parents and young people, she has been a keynote speaker at various national and international conferences. She also works as a Consultant Anaesthetist at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust in London.

Sangeeta has spoken at various retreats and conferences in the UK and abroad. Her words are honest, moving, inspiring, hopeful and helpful for anyone who has suffered deep loss.



Ado Matheson
Songs from the Heart

Ado Matheson is a Celtic singer and songwriter inspired by his family tradition of music especially his late grandfather who was crowned 'Celtic Bard' in the 50's for his writing. Ado has lost many members of his family and friends through addiction. However the greatest tragedy was losing his dear younger son William to heroin in 2013. His music and writing are helping him to heal and come to terms with his grief. He hopes above all else that his music will reach out and touch the hearts of those who have been there regardless of time and circumstances.



Liz and Charles Ritchie
Co-Founders of Charity Gambling with Lives

Charles and Liz lost their son Jack to suicide due to gambling disorder in November 2017. They set about finding out what had happened to him and to understand how something marketed as a "bit of fun" and promoted by the government had caused his death. They found many other families similarly bereaved and highly addictive products hidden by normalisation.

They will be speaking about the number of suicides linked to gambling and the work that they and other families have done through Gambling with Lives to support each other and raise awareness of the dangers of gambling, and in particular the high suicide risk.



James Sabin
DrugFAM's Junior Ambassador

When I was just nine years old my world was turned upside down when my eldest brother Daniel died of a drugs overdose. Since then I have tried hard to raise awareness about the dangers of drugs especially in schools to young people so that the same does not happen in their families.
